# Highlights from the March meeting

This month the church council continues to work on several outstanding items. Some highlights include:

- We haven't had much progress on the sale of Pastor Marcham's home. At this time, we have a couple of challenges with the sale. First, Pastor Marcham has a sales contract on the listing of the home. Although we have asked the realtor to release Pastor Marcham from the contract, the realtor has been unwilling to do so. The realtor is actively advertising the home for sale but does not have an offer at this time. The existing listing agreement expires in May. The interested buyer who contacted the church directly is still interested in purchasing the home but they have yet to sell their home.
- ◆ Council members discussed and agreed that the Food Shelf Fundraiser was a big success with over \$2,000 being raised for our local food shelf. While community attendance was a little less than expected, council recognized that these types of events often take some time to get known in the community. Many church members participated with this event and council wants to thank everyone for their help.
- ◆ Deacons announced that a Polka Service is scheduled for May 18<sup>th</sup>. This service was well received last year and we hope everyone will enjoy the music filled service again this year.
- ◆ Council reviewed the UCC template for a safe church policy as well as our existing Anti Discrimination policy which includes sexual harassment. After review of our existing Anti Discrimination Policy it was decided that the existing policy is adequate for the time being. The personnel committee will put this as a "to do" item for future consideration.
- Council discussed the future for our mutual ministries committee. Pastor Lois has mentioned that the PPRC committee is more commonly used among UCC churches.

It was noted that in the past, Mutual Ministries or PPRC have been used as a conduit for conversation between the pastor and members and friends of the congregation. Until we get the Mutual Ministries or PPRC committee activated again, church members and friends are encouraged to discuss items of concern with Pastor Lois or with a church council member.

- ◆ The personnel committee is currently working on developing job descriptions and reporting relationships for our church.
- The planning retreat scheduled for March was postponed. We are in the process of setting another date in April. Anyone interested in attending should contact me and I will let you know the new retreat date.
