



Special Community Event at UCC -- On Sunday, October 14th at 6:30 p.m. Dr. Colette Hyman will do a presentation at Gaylord UCC on the "150th Anniversary Year of the US - Dakota War" Dr. Hyman is a History Professor at Winona State University and has led presentations and written articles for the Minnesota Historical Society over the years on various events and issues surrounding the U.S. - Dakota War and Native American history in Minnesota. Her most recent book is "Dakota Women's Work." Refreshments will be served and all are welcome.

Scott Sparlin will be sharing his message on "Stewardship of Creation" and providing special music on Sunday, October 21st during our 9:00 a.m. Worship Service at Gaylord UCC. Scott is the Executive Director of the Coalition for a Clean Minnesota River since 1989. He is Watershed Initiative Coordinator for the Friends of the Minnesota Valley in Bloomington, Past President of the New Ulm Area Sport Fishermen and has been awarded the DNR Meritorious Service Award. Scott is a professional songwriter and musician in varied genres of musical styles such as Rock, Blues, Bluegrass, Folk, Country and Ethnic Old Time. He has been known, more than once, to utter the words, "Ya Sure, Ya Betcha."

A Family Update: Lately a number of folks have asked me what's up with "My 3 Sons?" Tim is seeking his Masters Degree at the University of Texas-Austin, in Landscape Architecture, Brian is attending Augsburg College in Mpls. with a major in Sociology, Colin is attending American University in Washington D.C. with a major in Journalism. FYI -- they were sighted together in Church at last December's Christmas Eve Services in both Gaylord and New Ulm.

Jesus' Family Update: The Scriptures tell us that Jesus as a child grew up in the family of Mary and Joseph. An ancient manuscript just discovered gives new credence to the possibility that Jesus had a wife. The manuscript, which is not to be equated with the Biblical record, has been interpreted to say, "My wife... she will be able to be my disciple." A Harvard professor, Karen King, says "This is the only extant ancient text which explicitly portrays Jesus as referring to a wife." Scholars say this discovery may have implications for elevating the role of women in the life of parts of the church. Did he or didn't he, have a wife. For me that is still a question. But either way it does not really make me change my following of Jesus.

Marriage Equality: I am including a summary report on page 6 of the "Conversations Affirming Marriage Equality" educational event at New Ulm UCC on Sept. 23. Rev. Rebecca Voelkel, a United Church of Christ pastor serving as Faith Works Director for the national GLBT Task Force, spoke to the primary biblical and theological understanding for marriage equality. Lori and Jeff Wilfahrt shared from their personal experience relating more to civic, political and constitutional values. Their son Andrew, who was homosexual, was killed as a soldier in combat in Iraq a few years ago. The report provides an educational understanding for responding faithfully in Church and society. I also have a couple of pastoral statements which lift up biblical and theological references for marriage equality which I will make available. Reformation Sunday (Oct. 30) is a good time to remember the "reforming" moments in church life, in the spirit of Jesus' own reforming and fulfilling of the Law.

Tony Campolo tells of two young men who wanted to participate in Urban Promise, his inner-city ministry. Yet they had a concern: "We don't believe in God. Can we still serve?"

After pausing, Campolo answered: "Yes, you can serve with us, but you'll have to pretend you believe. You'll have to pray and worship with the group, go to Bible study, teach the kids about Jesus, go through the motions all summer long. If you'll do that, you may help."

By summer's end, these young men were no longer pretending; they'd come to truly believe in Jesus. Furthermore, both went on to become priests in the Church of England.

We often speak of "living out" our faith, but what about "living into" it? Sometimes belief leads to profound experiences; other times, what we experience leads to profound belief.

SUMMARY OF "Marriage Equality" EDUCATIONAL EVENT at UCC New Ulm on Sept. 23, 2012

Members and friends of the United Church of Christ in New Ulm listened to presenters concerning marriage equality and the constitutional amendment defining marriage.

The amendment states: "Shall the Minnesota Constitution be amended to provide that only a union of one man and one woman shall be valid or recognized as marriage in Minnesota?"

The proposition has both legal and religious ramifications. A civil marriage is about equal access before the law for all citizens of this country. The religious aspect concerns the ability to hear the voice of God as we discern what is right in our hearts and in our actions.

Rev. Rebecca Voelkel, Faith Work Director for the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force in Minneapolis stated that marriage equality benefits society because it gives families greater economic and social stability which, in turn, gives the larger culture greater stability and grounding.

Rev. Voelkel stated that marriage in the Bible has many faces and that God is continually breaking into history, redeeming the world and revealing Godself. She spoke of worshipping the living God who revealed God's self to our ancestors, who revealed God's self in the person of Jesus Christ and who reveals God's self in our worship and in our study and in our research and prayers.

For Rev Voelkel, the Biblical imperative is to follow Jesus' commandment to love God and love your neighbor. The question becomes not whether a relationship is to be blessed based on the gender of each partner but whether a relationship is to be blessed based on the kind of love and justice that is exhibited by the individual partners and by the love and justice the relationship creates.

Lori and Jeff Wilfahrt spoke in support of their son Andrew and other members of the military who take an oath in support of freedom based on the constitution. Lori and Jeff stated that this amendment will deny and reduce the rights of a minority. Gay service members can now serve openly but they are denied the same spousal benefits extended to their straight colleagues. They stated that this vote is about freedom to marry and commit to the one you are in love with and protecting the constitution that our soldiers fight and die for.

Faith requires faithful action. As members of a Christian community that values the questions as well as the answers, what do you think about this? As we hear the voice of a Still speaking God, what does your faith, your life's story and your prayer life tell you to do?
