"Sharing and Celebrating"

It has been special for our 2 Shared Ministry churches to host "Beads On One String" this past year in Gaylord and New Ulm. And thanks to Dennis Warner for his presentation of the concrete, hope-filled concept – that we all have special things in common that connect us as God's children.

The idea of the string or cord or bond that holds all of us together with things we have in common is certainly an image that resonates with our Christian faith. When we are together we are made stronger for the sake of love and peace and justice. With Christ as our spiritual vine and we as the branches, there is a sacred and abiding strength (John's Gospel). Or as Proverbs says, "a three-fold cord cannot be broken." God being a vital partner in the relationship!

The recent edition of "Kinship Link" a monthly newsletter for the Pro Kinship for Kids agency tells this story to help bring the idea home:

A young boy was walking with an adult along a river bank. When they came across a huge rock in their path, the boy asked, "Do you think I could move the rock?" The adult answered, "If you use all your strength, I'm sure you can." The boy tried mightily to lift, pull and push the rock... but he couldn't budge it.

Discouraged, he said, "Hey you were wrong. I can't do it." The adult said, "Try again." This time as the boy struggled with the rock, the adult joined him and together they pushed the rock aside. Together they cleared the path to their destination. The adult observed, "The first time you didn't use all your strength – you didn't ask me to help."

We have many connections that can give us help in achieving our goals or reaching a destination – family, friends, mentors, faith communities and God. God connects us to our inner, spiritual strengths of humility, patience, courage and hope. Sometimes we fail to ask for help because of pride or stubbornness. Sometimes we think it's a sign of weakness to admit we need a hand. And yet, in the times when we're asked to lend a helping hand, we'll rediscover that the blessings of life are found in both the giving and receiving.



Pilgrim Point Camp "Status Update"

As the 2013 camping season comes to a close, we are at the end of a three-year period where the Conference has been trying to innovate and transform our Pilgrim Point ministry. Looking ahead, the Pilgrim Point Camp Committee will receive a final report from our camp consultant, Kaleidoscope, Inc., in late October and present the report, with preliminary recommendations for future action, to the Board of Directors on November 2nd. The Board will consider the report and initial recommendations, solicit input broadly around the Conference, receive any final recommendations from the Pilgrim Point Camp Committee by December 15th, and vote on next steps for Pilgrim Point at its January 4th meeting. As we finished our meeting earlier this month, the joint session affirmed our gratitude for the dynamic growth at Pilgrim Point in recent years due to the passion and commitment of excellent staff and an increasing number of churches in the Conference. The Board of Directors is committed to proactive communication throughout the Conference and requests your prayers during the discernment of these coming months.
